CCTV Policy

Introduction

This policy sets out the principles and procedures for the use of CCTV at The Norway Inn, Perranarworthal.

Purposes of CCTV

CCTV is used at Inn Cornwall Limited at The Norway Inn, Perranarworthal for the following purposes:

- To deter and detect crime and antisocial behaviour.
- To ensure the safety of customers and staff.
- To protect property.
- To provide evidence in the event of an incident.
- Monitor staff for performance and training purposes
- Monitor customer flow at service points

Location of Cameras

CCTV cameras are located at the following areas of The Victoria Inn:

- Entrance and exit
- External road and car parks
- Bar area
- Lounge Bar
- Gardens
- Corridors
- Restaurant area
- Service areas

Recording and Retention of Images

CCTV images are recorded 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Footage is retained for a period of no longer than 30 days, unless there is a good reason to keep it for longer.

Access to and Disclosure of Images

CCTV images may be accessed by the following people:

- Company management
- Staff (viewing)
- Company Directors
- The police

CCTV images may be disclosed to the police or other law enforcement agencies if there is a reasonable suspicion of criminal activity.

Individuals' Access Rights

Anyone who has been recorded by the CCTV system has the right to request a copy of the footage. Requests for footage should be made to the pub manager or company director – mark@inncornwall.co.uk

Covert Recording

Covert recording is not permitted at The Victoria Inn, Threemilestone.

Staff Training

All staff who have access to the CCTV system must be trained in the use of the system and the data protection implications of CCTV.

Review

This policy will be reviewed annually to ensure that it remains compliant with the Data Protection Act 2018 and the ICO CCTV Code of Practice.
